### **Response to Black Women and Inequality**

From the times of slavery, capitalism has been interwoven in the fabric of this country. Like a contract, loopholes will continue to be exploited. On August 3, 2021, we are suppose to celebrate Black Women's Equal Pay Day. However the name is deceiving but its not true. Instead of making what a man makes currently, being a female on a day like today you'll be making, his last year's salary. Black women earn .63 cents for every dollar that white women earn. Due to the pandemic, Black women have the most lost income, layoff, and reduced hour than men and most women. Constantly keeping them one step behind, while being told to keep up. Bills don't adapt to what you make, you adapt to the bill itself. Black women have the highest percentage of being the breadwinners for their families.

Depending on the state, black women cant even afford a two bedroom apartment. Black women also have to deal with the racial disparities in the U.S housing system. White people denied blacks access to wealth building opportunities. White people were taught "block busting" and "red lining" to deny black people of loans or mortgages refinancing and keep them out of white communities. Landlords would recommend a different house in a different community to applicants that were black. According to the U.S. Census, 1 in 5 renters likely to face eviction are Black women. People of color was continuously labeled and ill equipped to owning a home. They are forced to live in poor buildings and homes that are deemed unsafe and exposes them to to certain toxins. This impacts their quality of life and makes it hard for them to provide for themselves and their families. These black families living in these poor buildings can not afford good or any healthcare.

The Healthcare system has inequalities that impact people of color. This inequality leads to less health insurance coverage, uneven access to services, and poorer health outcomes. People of color are experiencing "illness and infirmity at extremely high rates and have lower life expectancy than other racial and ethnic groups". The cost of health insurance is high which makes it difficult for people to afford it. Medicaid is a federal and state program that provides healthcare at little to no price to low income families. Black women are more likely to fall in the coverage gap, where they make too much to receive Medicaid but not enough to purchase insurance. NAM found that "racial and ethnic minorities receive lower-quality health care than white people—even when insurance status, income, age, and severity of conditions are comparable." Black women have maternal health disparities. They are more likely to experience a pregnancy related death than white some. Black women are also three time more to experience complications throughout their pregnancies than white women.

Black Lives Matter is a movement to fight against systematic inequality and police brutality on blacks. In 2020, "more than 40 percent of counties in the United States" participated in a Black Lives Matter protest to seek justice for black people. A black person has a higher rate of being killed by a cop and arrested for low-level offenses. BLM begun in 2015, after a innocent black teen named Trayvon Martin, was shot walking back home from a convenience store. During the protest, people would shout out the names of the innocent people who were killed by cops. BLM is fighting for all black people but we mainly hear the names of black men and not black women. People don't know who Natasha Mckeena, Alexia Christian, Shelly Frey,

Rekia Boyd, and Aiyanna Stanley Jones is. These people were all wrongfully killed by cops but people don't know their names. According to Washington Post, in 2015, 250 women were killed wrongfully by cops, including 48 black women. These women are falling in the cracks because no one are talking about them.

### **Recommendation**, Suggestions, Solutions

I believe society needs to change and we need to stop discrimination. It is not enough to focus on intentional discrimination but acknowledge implicit bias and address it. People judge black people before getting to know them. They are scared of us and don't want us to have power. We need to come together and get to know each other and hear our stories. School educates the kids about what black people went through in the past but they don't tell them how we still face many disparities and discrimination. Schools need to take more than a month to talk about black history.

I also believe we need to continue to support and fight with BLM. They are doing something amazing but they need to remember the black women as well.
